Children's Ministries Report

The children's ministries team is a newly created team of dedicated members happy to be working together with the Sabbath School Leaders, to minister to our youngest members of Willowdale Church.

Plans for 2023:

Restart distribution of children's bulletins during worship service.

Restart distribution of Sabbath School magazines (Little Friend, Primary Treasure & Guide).

The team is also planning a VBS program for Summer 2023 and will be looking for volunteers, so stay tuned!

Prayer Ministries

The Prayer Ministries mission is to provide a Holistic environment where members intercede and petition for the church families and others.

The Prayer Ministries is a compassionate ministry that supporta members through the various life cycles.

The mid-week prayer service continues to be on the Zoom platform and has seen a growth in attendance. These sessions are led by the Willowdale Pastors and Elders.

The mid-week prayer meeting is currently using the "Book 2 - 40 Days Prayers and Devotions to Revive Your Experience with God" by Dennis Smith as the Devotional reading.

The Prayer and Fast program is held every First Sabbath of the Month. This program continues to be held on Zoom.

The Prayer Ministries participated in the Annual 10 Days of Prayer from January 11 – 20, 2023. The theme was "Back to the Altar".

The Prayer Ministries also supports all Conference-led Prayer initiatives.

Women's Ministries

With the return of a more normal church family experience, meeting the needs of the women of the church is our goal. Women's Ministries cannot be "a one size fits all" so it is still very much a work in progress.

One of the activities that is up and running is a monthly Sabbath School for the teens & young women of Willowdale. Here is an update from Abby Mathi-Amorim.

"Within the last few months, we have started a monthly young ladies' Sabbath School class for the women in the high-school and young adult classes. We sip on cups of tea as we catch up with each other, discuss lessons from the Bible, and do our best to grow the feeling of friendship and community between the young women of Willowdale. Our goal is to continue to create a class in which Willowdale's young women will be excited to attend and have an opportunity to learn from the Bible and from each other.'

Coming from the idea that the church ministries should work together, not each one off in its own sphere, Christmas cards were sent to the senior ladies of the church who can no longer attend in person. The names came from both senior's ministries and the church office. My hope is that I will follow up with reaching out to them on a regular basis.

Because ministry should be both to our church community and our local community, other local Adventist churches that partner through the "The Hub" across the street are looking to the ladies of Willowdale to become involved in that ministry. They have plans for zoom meetings in February (7 & 23) and in person on March 8 with the topic being "sharing stories.'

Lastly I would like to remind any lady who can attend, that the conference is planning a ladies' retreat on March 17-19, 2023 entitled "Treasured" at the Muskoka Bible Centre in Huntsville. (By the way the Centre looks beautiful).
